
Winslow in 1556: The survey of the manor

The manor of Winslow, including Granborough and Little Horwood, was surveyed in 1556, probably to maximise revenue for the Crown. Winslow was in royal ownership after the dissolution of St Albans Abbey, and in 1556 had an absentee landlord who owed the Crown money and a resident bailiff.

Then the surveyor Thomas Gedge came to call.



Putting together the 1556 Survey with other historical documents — wills, inventories, parish registers, legal records, David Noy develops a panorama of Winslow's economic, social and religious life in the mid-16th century.
