- 2. Note 6 waies of mixing this
- 3. Take a [interlined Quarter] Pound of the Glasse of Arsenick
- 4. beaten small as may be, that it be not
- 5. greecy
- 6. [in margin 1] Then take * thimblefuls of that Pouder
- 7. & as many of Sugar, & 5 spoones full of
- 8. Wheate flower, & as much sweet creame
- 9. as will make this into a thinne Past, &
- 10. lay it about upon C'hips, in the places
- 11. where they run
- 12. [in margin 2] Another way of Mixing it
- 13. Take 3 Tosts of white Bread, tost
- 14. them well without smoaking them, put
- 15. them in a glass of Sack or Ale for a qua
- 16. ter of an houre, then take it out, And
- 17. put to it 5 thimblesfull of the foresaid
- 18. pouder, & as many of sugar, & mixe
- 19. it well with the Tostes, & lay it in the
