Library and Archives Report

The Library Team of Julian Hunt, Roger Bettridge and Sarah Gray has continued to open the Library to the public every Wednesday. In addition, we respond to a variety of distance enquiries, mainly by email, which are either answered from the Society's own resources or passed on, as appropriate, to members with relevant expertise or other institutions, such as the Centre for Bucks Studies, the County Museum or the County Council's Archaeology Service.

We also deal with requests for publications, including the Society's most recent publications – Mike Farley's booklet on Quarrendon and Peter Gulland's *Toll Roads of Buckinghamshire* – and articles from past editions of *Records of Bucks*. Assisted by other members of the Society, we ran bookstalls at three events in 2017: the Bucks Family History Society's Open Day (29 July), the Bucks Local History Network Conference (30 September) and the Centre for Bucks Studies' Local History Fair (18 November).

An innovation this year has been the Bucks Book Exchange, in which duplicate copies of books already held in the Library, many of them donated by members, are offered for sale through the Newsletter. From the two lists published so far, some two dozen items have been purchased, suggesting that this is a useful service. Less successful, so far at least, has been the attempt to stimulate interest in the wide variety of journals and magazines that BAS subscribes to. A list of titles held was published in the Spring Newsletter, 2017, and a variety of recent acquisitions have been made available for loan at Saturday afternoon lectures.

Marshall has continued to work on uncatalogued archive material in the muniment room and has compiled a catalogue of Professor Bill Mead's archive. Our predecessor Marian Miller has delivered her catalogue of Diana Gulland's research materials on Aston Clinton House. And we have welcomed a new volunteer to our ranks, Peter Longden, who has been updating our computerised catalogue of books.

A notable accession during the year is a small archive received from the estate of the architect Eric Throssell, a longstanding BAS member, who died in 2016. The highlight of this archive is a number of framed drawings of Bucks buildings on which Mr Throssell worked, showing his magnificent draughtsmanship, but it also includes photographs, plans and other records relating to buildings in the county with which he was connected. This archive is currently being catalogued.
