SIR WILLIAM BORLASE'S BENEFACTIONS TO MARLOW.

BORLASE SCHOOL

Originally founded to teach 24 boys reading, writing, and arithmetic, and the same number of girls to "knit. spin, and make bone-lace," has grown to importance The school was carried on under the provisions of Sir William Borlase's will, 1628, until the year 1878, when it was made a second-grade school by the Charity Commission, with an exhibition of £30 per annum, and 12 foundation scholarships open to boys educated in any of the elementary schools of Marlow, Little Marlow, or Medmenham. He also founded a "house of correction," which, with the girls' school, have disappeared, the trustees alleging, according to Langley, in his "Hundred of Desborough," that "the estates are inadequate to it." But the "Free-school" has flourished exceedingly. New buildings have been added to the original 17th century house, and upwards of a hundred boys are now educated here.

The following transcript is from a contemporary extract of Sir William Borlase's will in so far as it referred to these endowments, and is preserved in the school chest amongst other deeds, and, by the courtesy of my colleagues the governors or "ffeofees," I am allowed to print it:—

S^{ir} William Borlase Senio^r his Will

that part w^{ch} belongeth to the ffree Schooll

And whereas I have erected a House & bought also some other Houses & Lands in Great Marlow to bee imployed for the charitable uses hereafter expressed as a memorial of my late Good Soune Hen: Borlase my Will is y^e said house and other houses & Lands shall wholly bee imployed for ever for the Benefit of the Poore of y^e said Parish of Great Marlow Little Marlow & Medmenham and none other Parish in manner hereafter as I shall hereby express: And whereas I have allready as much in houses & Lands

in Great Marlow as will amount unto fourteen Pounds a yeare not valuing herein the new house I have built for the schoole house And my meaning is if it please God to give mee soe long life to buy twenty Pounds a yeare in Lands or rent charge to lay also to ve charitable uses hereafter expressed And if it should please God to take mee out of this miserable World before I can buy ve said twenty Pounds a yeare: then I give bequeath & my Will is four Hundred Pounds should be bestowed by my executors for the purchasing ye said twenty Pounds a yeare more at ye least by him: I have bought at bix in ye county of Oxon: about twenty foure Pounds a veare in lands & two Houses all which shall be laid for ever to the said house to these uses following-and to bee assured with all ve said former Houses & Lands by my sonn & executor to 12 ffeofees whereof 8 of them shall bee chosen by him in ye towne & Parish of Great Marlow three in ye Parish of Little Marlow & one in ye Parish of Medmenham & when any of the said ffeofees shall Dve that ve surviving ffeofees or the greatest part of them shall p'sent ve names of some other fitt persons to succeed in ye place of him soe deceasing to my said executor dureing his life Governor of ye said House & Lands and hee shall chose such one of them as hee shall think fit to succeed as ffeofee with the rest surviving And after his decease I appoint the Lord of the manner of Davers in the Parish of Little Marlow for v^e time beeing ever hereafter to bee Governor of ye said House & Lands soe appointed & hereafter intended to bee purchased ye Profits whereof I doe appoint to bee employed as followeth Imprimis 12 Pounds a yeare shall be allowed for a schoolmaster to teach 24 poore children to wright reade & cast v³ account in wrighting such as their Parents & ffreinds are not able to maintaine at schoolle to be taken into y^e said schoole between y^e age of tenn and ffourteen and after any of them can wright reade & cast ye Accompt which I estimate in two yearss they will be ready to doe My Will is ye ffeofees or the greater part of them shall at every Easter present ye number of twelve of ye fittest and the best learned of them to the Governor for y^e time being after my sons decease

and hee ye said Governor at ye time beeing shall chose six of them to whome my Will is shall be given forty shillings a peice towards ye Binding of them Apprentices to some trades And soe likewise I doe appoin ye said ffeofees or ye greater number of them when any are upon places void to be putt into ye schoole, or any as aforesd, to be prefered at any Easter, to present out of those Parishes where ve number is void. double v^e number of those that are to be taken in, or prefered, to ye said Governour, and hee then shall chose who shall have the Benefitt of ye place void or bee preferred with the forty shillings: And touching the choise of y^e schoollmaster for y^e time beeing my Will is ye Governour for ye time beeing with ye consent of ye greatest part of ye ffeofees shall after my said Sonns decease from time to time appoint or remove him: And the said schoolemaster besides ve twelve Pounds a veare shall enjoy & have to himselfe wholly ve new house to dwell in where now Smith schoolemaster dwelleth, without paying any Rent, and also the Garden which hee now holdeth, together with sufficient roome in y^e backside to lay fuell in for his own provision, the which House the said schoole master, and succeeding schoolemasters, shall from time to time repayre My further Will is that there shall be vearely bought by the ffeofees two Reame of Paper allowed for ye said schollers, and Primmers, Psalters, & some new testaments, as may serve for v^e said Poore Children, to learne to wright & readefurther my will is yt the House where now Hugh Tanner dwelleth adjoyning to ye said schoolhouse wth ye Barne adjoyning to the west side of ye said House of Hugh Tanner shall be for ever employed as a Work house & House of correction for ye said three Parishes & none other & ye said Hugh Tanner & his successors shall be chosen into that place accordingly as y^e schoolemaster is hereby Appointed to be chosen and hee & they shall have for wages beesides ye said House Barn and orchard adjoyneing to ye said Barne ye summe of six Pounds or eight Pounds a yeare as y^e Governour & ffeofees or y^e greater part of them after my sonn's death shall thinke fitt: & hee shall teach yearely 24 Weomen Chilldren of ye Burrough of great

Marlow only to make Bonelace to spin or to knitt to be putt to him by ve Churchwardens and Ovseers of ye Poore of Great Marlow towne and Parish with consent of the greater part of y^e ffeofees & Governour as is before appointed: And the said Hugh Tanner & his successors shall whip or cause to be whipped all such offenders as ye Petty Constables Officers or Tything men of any of ve said three Parishes shall bring to him w^{ch} by y^e Laws of this Realme are to be whipped for any offences so punishable by ye Comon Laws or Statutes of this Realme & shall also punish such delinquents of Great Marlow as ye said Churchwardens & Ovseers thereof or y^e greatest part of them shall with the consent of One Justice of the Peace deliver over to him ve said Hugh Tanner or his successors to be punished according to y^e statute: And shall keep for four days in his House of Correction any Rouge or Vagabond taken within the town or Parish of Great Marlow Little Marlow and Medmenham or any of them, but not out of other Parishes which by Lawfull Authority shall be sent to him and shall use such punishment & correccon upon the Person soe sent as may be done by ye Laws of this Realme: my Will and meaning also is that if there be any surplusage hereafter of Rent to be had out of the Houses & Lands which are or shall be laid to the fores^d uses vⁿ v^e said surplusage shall be bestowed further to such uses for the Benefit of the Poore afores^d as by the Governour for the time being with Assent of v^e Greater part ye ffeofees shall be thought fitt: And my Will is they shall lett out v^o said Houses & Lands at the best and highest rates they can well get because it is for ye good of the said Poore provided allwaies & my will & meaning is y^t my executor my sonn shall during his Life have full and sole power to himselfe to place, remove carefor & take in ffeofees, schoolemaster, schollars, master of the house of correccon & those aforesaid which he is to teach without ve Assent of any other at his own discrettion And that ye manner of election Appointing & removeing before herein expressed shall be used in forme aforesaid only from & after my said Sonns decease) the Will made August ye 20th 1628 & Assigned October the 16th 1628: And
