# ANNUAL EXCURSION, 1922.

The annual excursion was made to London, where visits were paid to the Church of St. Bartholomew the Great, to the Charterhouse, the Priory Church of St. John of Jerusalem, St. John's Gate, and Butchers' Hall. The wonderful twelfth century building of St. Bartholomew was explained to the visitors by Mr. E. A. Webb, Churchwarden, and Mr. H. W. Fincham, F.S.A., performed the same kind office of lecturer during the visit to St. John's Church and Gate, where very much of the highest interest was to be seen. Mr. Philip Rutland, master of the Butchers' Company, gave a short address upon the history of that Company, and provided tea for the members present.

It is unnecessary to describe in detail places outside our county; a full description of all that the large number of members present were shown appeared in the Bucks Herald of 1st July, 1922; the account contains one slip, however, for it states that the annual excursion had probably never been held in London; that is not so, because in 1880 the Society visited Westminster Abbey, Lambeth Palace, and Temple Church.
