

OBITUARY

The Society regrets to have lost by death two old members The Hon. CECIL FREMANTLE, of Radclive, and Major G. F. GREEN, of Chetwode.

Whilst this number of the RECORDS was in the Press a further loss was sustained in the person of Mr. WILLIAM CROUCH, who had held a position on the Council for many years, and was a regular attendant at meetings until prevented by failing health. Mr. Crouch was interested in all the Society's activities, but his knowledge was particularly useful in the case of the 17th century Trade Tokens of the County. On this subject he wrote a valuable paper (with illustrations) in the tenth volume of the RECORDS, and, by his will, has generously left to the Society his important collection of tokens, together with other objects; it is hoped to give a more full account of these in the next issue of the RECORDS. Mr. Crouch's long tenure of office as Clerk of the Peace and Clerk to the County Council brought him into contact with many records, and from them he compiled a list of Lord Lieutenants and Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, which is incomplete, but it is hoped to finish and publish it at a later date.
