EDITOR'S NOTE

With the issue of the first part of a new volume the hon. Editor calls attention to the increase in size from demy to royal octavo, the larger type and leaded spacing.

To change the size of a journal which has been issued for nearly 80 years is a serious step, and it was only taken by the Council after full consideration and in order to obtain an improved *format* and larger illustrations. The present issue is not final, as further typographical improvements are hoped for in the issue of 1935.

Whilst thus explaining the new externals of our *Records* the hon. Editor has to deplore the lack of support he has received as regards contributions ; he feels that the improved setting deserves better material than that with which he has himself had to fill a large part of the present number. The increase in membership in recent years makes one hope that some amongst them could usefully contribute to the enlightenment of all. A member may have a certain amount of material not quite ready for publication, by communicating with the Editor he might find that further matter is available. It is hoped at any rate that every member with original work in hand, or even with an idea for such work, will get into touch with the Editor, who will be pleased to render any assistance in his power.
