EDITOR'S NOTE

With the issue of the first part of a new volume the hon. Editor calls attention to the increase in size from demy to royal octavo, the larger type and leaded spacing.

To change the size of a journal which has been issued for nearly 80 years is a serious step, and it was only taken by the Council after full consideration and in order to obtain an improved *format* and larger illustrations. The present issue is not final, as further typographical improvements are hoped for in the issue of 1935.
