ANNUAL MEETING

The Society's Annual Meeting was held at the Museum on 2 May, 1936, Major Coningsby Disraeli being in the chair. There was a large attendance owing to the fact that the fine gift of Bucks lace, bobbins, and parchments, formerly belonging to the late Miss Burrowes, of Maids Moreton, and presented to the Museum by her executor,—was on view, and a short address on lace was delivered by Miss Channer. The bobbins display great variety, from the simplest ones made of wood or bone, to the elaborate ones inlaid with pewter, or those carved with a smaller bobbin inserted, whilst some are made of brass or copper, and one rare example is of glass.

The recent extension of space for exhibition will enable a permanent display to be made of articles so closely associated with the county in the past, and members appreciated the handsome addition to the Society's possessions, and the admirable way in which it was displayed by the Curator.
