PHOTOGRAPHIC RECORDS OF CHURCHES AND IMPORTANT SECULAR BUILDINGS.

BRONZE AGE RELIC FROM WADDESDON

In the recent Antiquaries Journal, the gift of two gold bracelets of the Late Bronze Age to the British Museum is reported by Mr. T. D. Kendrick. They were found 40 or 50 years ago in ploughed land at Waddesdon, and have now been presented by Capt. J. H. S. Clark, of Wareham. The larger is 2.7 inches across, and weighs 763.4 grains.
