SEVENTEENTH CENTURY INVENTORY AT CRAFTON

The following inventory, which occurs among the deeds of the Mentmore estate and is now published by kind permission of the Right Honble the Earl of Rosebery, gives a very full account of the possessions of a country gentleman towards the close of the XVIIth century, and is of much interest on that account.

William Theed, of Crafton in the parish of Wing, was the second son of William Theed of Horton Hall by his wife Elizabeth, the daughter of Christopher Egleton of Ellesborough.

About the end of the XVIth century his great grandfather, John Theed, a yeoman of Ledburn in the parish of Mentmore, began to purchase free-hold and copyhold lands in Crafton where he and his son John eventually acquired an estate of about 140 acres. Their mansion-house, which formerly stood in a close called the Wick, was probably built by the younger John early in the XVIIth century. With hall and parlour, buttery, kitchen, etc., and nine bedrooms, it was evidently of importance, but save for slight irregularities in the surface of the soil, no trace remains of the building, which was pulled down a few years before 1838.

William Theed was baptized at Wing 1 Oct 1635 and married Mary, the daughter of Elkanah Gladman, Vicar of Wing, 9 Jan. 1665/6. He was buried in Wing church, 19 June 1680.

The Register records the baptism of the following children:—

His widow, Mary, was buried in Wing Church 9 Aug 1720. None of his children left issue, and the survivor of them—Anne—was buried at Wing 15 Oct: 1735.

By his will, dated 16 June 1680 and proved 13 May 1681, he gave £200 to his eldest son William "for his education and bringing him up Schollar at the University of Oxford." To his daughter Mary £350 at 22 years of age. daughter Abigail £300 at 22 years of age. To his To his sons John and Thomas £300 each to put them apprentice to a trade and towards setting them up in their trades. To his daughter Anne £300 at 22 years of age. After making provision for the raising of moneys towards the payment of these legacies and for the raising of a further £600 to be paid, £120 each, to his five youngest children, he gave to his wife Mary his silver salt-cellar and twelve silver spoons, one silver plate, his best bed and furniture, and all the furniture in his best room, three pairs of flaxen sheets, three pairs of hempen sheets, one pair of holland sheets, and two pairs of pillow-biers. To her also he gave one silver-gilt spoon, five guineas in gold, three broad-pieces of gold and one ten shilling piece of gold and her silver watch,1 "which are already hers and in her custody," and such household stuff as she shall choose, to the value of £20. He appoints his wife Mary, his brothers John and Thomas Theed, and his cousin Thomas Theed his executors.
