## ARCHÆOLOGICAL

Palæolithic flint scrapers, from Chalfont St. Giles Neolithic axe-head of polished tuff, found at Chorley Wood Portion of vessel, Iron Age A, found near Concord Wood, Wendover

Half of Roman horse-shoe, found near Southcourt, Aylesbury Sixteenth-century earthenware jug, found at Newport Pagnell

## NATURAL HISTORY

Bed of marine shells, from the churchyard, Lane End Part of a sauropodous dinosaur vertebra, a derived fossil

from the alluvial gravel, Clifton Reynes Mammoth molar, from Leighton Buzzard sandpits Little owl, 9, from Manor Park, Aylesbury Magpie, 3, from Tring Black-headed gull, 3, from Tring Reservoirs Locust from Italy, found in vegetable crate

## BYGONES

Iron hook for removing burning thatch, used at Tring Goffering stand and iron, from Norduck Shepherd's crook and a winnowing riddle, from Little Brickhill

Steward's staff, 1792, belonging to William Dickins Horn drinking mug

Five pairs of steel-rimmed spectacles, early nineteenth-century, belonging to the Dancer family at Grandborough

Sailmaker's presser, used as envelope presser, and eighteenthcentury brass pastry-jigger

Silk flowers on wire, mounted in vase under glass dome

- Two wooden cylindrical pencil-boxes with slate pencils, used by donor's father at school in Aylesbury, also child's alphabet, c. 1870
- Blanket coat with cape worn at Bledlow by recipient of "Great Coat Charity," established by Henry Smith in 1627

## THE MUNIMENT ROOM

Court Rolls and Court Books of the Manor of Aylesbury with Bierton and Rectory of Aylesbury, 1650–1916 Court Book of the Manor of Broughton Staveley, 1801–1902

Court Rolls of some Chesham manors, uncatalogued owing to poor state and need of repair, one *temp*. Elizabeth, the rest apparently seventeenth and eighteenth centuries

Collection of deeds from Missenden Abbey estate, seventeenth to nineteenth centuries

- Collection of deeds relating to the Tower estate, Iver, received per Essex and Bucks. County Councils
- Papers, including probate inventory, 1727, and diary, 1728; letters and deeds belonging to the Bakers of Penn, related to the 1st Earl of Sheffield, great-great-grandfather of owner
