

ARCHÆOLOGICAL NOTES FROM THE BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY MUSEUM

THE list given below includes all archæological finds brought to the attention of the Buckinghamshire County Museum during 1966 and, unless otherwise stated, they were actually made in that year. Where a number is given in brackets at the end of an entry, the material concerned has been given to the Museum and has this accession number.

Aylesbury, Bedgrove Farm

Excavations on the site of the Deserted Medieval Village of Caldecote were continued by the Buckinghamshire County Museum. The foundations of a building approximately 30 ft. square and the floor of a barn 36 ft. × 17 ft. 6 in. were discovered and an earlier phase of occupation represented by a ditch containing 13th century pottery, sealed by cobbling, found.

Thirteenth century sherds were found in the garden by Mr. R. W. Griffiths.

Romano-British and Medieval sherds were found by Mr. R. W. Griffiths in soil scraped off before building work was started.

Fourteenth century sherds were found in the garden by Mr. R. W. Griffiths.

A denarius of Hadrian was dug up in the garden by Mr. Paul Acton in 1964.

Neolithic flint flakes and artifacts were found by Mr. L. H. Barfield during road works.

A Palæolithic hand axe was found when excavations were made for the foundations of the school by Mr. M. Baker.

Romano-British sherds were found in the north bank of the River Ouse by Mr. K. Field.

Ring ditches were found by Mr. C. Stanley from an air photograph.

A Sestertius of Hadrian was dug up in the garden by Mr. F. D. Balcombe.

Flint flakes, probably Neolithic, and a 13th century jug and sherds were found by Mr. L. H. Barfield during road works.
